Granting Of Extensions

Instructions for

League Managers, Club Scorer's and Shooters.

Produced in conjunction with the S.C.S.B.R.A. Handbook which also includes Surrey competition rules.

These can be downloaded from the below links. It is recommended that ALL participant's; familiarise themselves with those rules and regulations together with the Governing body rules of the N.S.R.A.

Reproduced from the competition handbook

1) **G10: Closing Date for Shooting.**

- 2) Cards must be fired in the correct order.
- 3) Cards **must** be in the scorers' hands not later than the Saturday following the published closing date for the round or stage of the competition, which will be a Monday.
 - a. [See published shoot by dates here.](#)
- 4) If a card arrives after that date, it will only be accepted if proof is obtained of postage within 24 hours of the last day of shooting.
 - a. Due to internal club scoring this clearly no longer applies, however; cards not received by the club scorer in accordance with 3) above must be reported to the league manager with an explanation of the delay. They will make a decision as to whether the cards may be accepted.

1) **G11: Extensions of closing dates**

- 2) Extensions to final dates of shooting for each round will only be permitted in exceptional circumstances:
 - a. e.g., illness,
 - b. or range closure.
 - c. Forgot is not a valid reason for an EXT.
- 3) Scorers may grant extensions of one round,
 - a. Now that club scorers are used rather than the league managers being the competition scorers; it is the league managers who shall grant the Extensions and **NOT** the club scorer.

- b. A shooter; recognising that they will not be able to shoot their cards by the due date; should do the following:
 - i. E-Mail their respective club/discipline captain and club scorer ASAP.
 - ii. Detailing why an extension is required.
 - iii. The club scorer should forward the extension request to the relevant league manager.
 - iv. The [league manager](#) will make the decision as to whether to grant or not and, for what amount of time. (Usually one round or if monthly, two rounds).
 - v. The league manager will reply via E-mail to the scorer with the decision and the time scale.
 - vi. The decision is passed to the shooter.
- 4) but for longer extensions,
 - a. permission of the Overall League controller must be obtained.
 - b. this is [Ian Pettett](#).
 - c. he will also act as arbiter in cases of dispute.
 - d. If unable to be resolved, it will be passed to the [chief stats officer](#) for final judgement.
- 5) **Extensions will not be granted for the final round in any competition.**
- 6) Extensions delay the publication of full results, and will be avoided, if possible, particularly in view of rule G12.
- 1) **G12: Advance Shooting**
- 2) Competitors may shoot cards as far in advance as they wish, except as stated in the rules for specific competitions, but they must be fired in round number order.
